 - ii. We currently have \$430,000 in our bank account. We currently have a lot of funds in CD's which are ready to mature. We will be renewing these CD's at a rate of 3.44%

- II. General Chair Report- Marco Greico
 - a. A current version of the Policy and Procedures is available on the Adirondack Swimming Website
 - b. Sean Caron has stepped down as the Safe Sport Chair and Outreach Chair effective immediately. Any interested candidates should reach out to Marco. Sean mentioned that he would help with the transition.
 - c. There is an opening on the Governance Committee. Any interested candidates should reach out to Marco or Alison
 - d. Welcome Alyssa DiFabio to the board as she will be the new Age Group Vice Chair
 - e. Great representation of Adirondack at the USA Swimming Convention in Denver
 - f. New this year: Returning Clubs have to pay a \$250 fee. New clubs have to pay a \$750 fee.
- III. Finance Report- John Splendido & Debbie Erickson
 - a. Adirondack Swimming has approximately \$404,000. We are \$7,000 from last year. John mentioned that we are financially stable at this time.
 - b. Registration Costs are up by 3%
 - c. Josh Wolin brought up that there are 14 pending Outreach applications from the Albany Starfish. Since there is no chair, Marco will look into this issue

- V. Tech Planning- Jerry Adams
 - a. New cut times have been posted in blue. No times have gotten faster
 - b. Sites for 2025 Silvers are Niskayuna and Shenendehowa. Niskayuna will host the Fridam PM session
 - c. The breakdown of the teams by site will be shared with coaches and posted on the Adirondack website shortly.
- VI. Athletes - Ally Dheeradhada
 - a. Attended the All-Business Meeting at Denver and got a lot of great information & resources
 - b. The Athletes Committee would like to set up a Mock Meet sometime in December for new swimmers & parents
 - i. Some limitations would be securing a pool location, finding adequate help to run the meet
- VII. Officials- JoAnn Faucett
 - a. We have approximately 65 officials. 60 of them have already re-registered for this season
 - b. 12 new officials from 6 different teams attended the official's clinic held on 9/22
 - c. JoAnn has expressed that each team should have an official's coordinator for their team to help with their home meets
 - d. Background Check Fees vary from person to person. If you have any questions about charges, call the background check company.
 - e. If you are a meet host, you need to have a registered Administrative Official
 - f. Creating a small budget to be used to reward officials as acknowledgement of their hard work and dedication to the sport.
 - i. John and Debbie mentioned that they could "ear-mark" \$2000 for this incentive

 - iv. Adirondack does not have access to very many LCM meets
 - v. Could there be more SCM meets?
 - vi. Proposal fails
 - b. Amanda Nappi has agreed to create a survey that teams will fill out of their inventory they are willing to share to help run Adirondack meets
 - c. Addition to 8 and Under to Golds
 - i. Motion by Josh Jock Seconded by Jon Parks
 - ii. A discussion was held and the following were highlighted:
 - 1. Jerry- 8&u is not a recognized age group in USA Swimming
 - 2. Jerry- If we add a group, we would have to subtract something to balance the timeline
 - 3. Rob- No 4-hour rule for championship meets. We are already renting the space out.
 - 4. Josh Jock- A lot os swimming for the 11 & 12 age group in a short amount of time
 - 5. JoAnn- How many 8&U do we expect to qualify? If they are fast enough, they can qualify for all 10&U events at golds
 - 6. Josh Wolin- We are focusing on developing the sport and regaining numbers due to the pandemic. We are already adding breaks into Golds, adding 8&U would help alleviate that problem. There are 2 sites for Silvers, it does not have that championship atmosphere for the athletes
 - iii. The HOD agreed on the following guidelines:
 - 1. 8&U will have no 25 yard events
 - 2. They will be swimming on Saturday and Sunday only
 - iv. A vote was held and the motion passes unanimously.
 - 1. This will take in effect for the 2026 Adirondack Golds Championships

AD LSC Registrar Report Spring 2025 Meetings BOD and HOD

Below are the year to date AD Member summary for 2025 and the member type/fee breakdown and the total 2024 season summary. So far, we have overall about 60 less athletes than the 2024 total (87 less Flex) and about the same number of non-athletes as 2024. I would expect a few additional registrations before the 2025 season is over. We are still running about 400 below pre-covid levels.

Reminder - New for this (2025) registration season;

Seasonal Athlete Memberships will be effective for 150 days from the date the athlete registers. In the past, seasonal athletes expired on the last day of the declared season no matter when they registered.

This will cause some issues for club admins and head coaches when trying to keep track of when their Seasonal athlete's memberships expire. Please be aware of this change.

AD uses one season, our Season 1, which begins April 1st and ends August 28th.

We open registration for Season 1 on March 20th and close it on August 15th.

Club Admins can now select their choice of Bulk Renewal for 2026 if they want. This can be changed up to August 31st. 2026 Offerings will be available to set up in mid August.

Clubs must have an assigned Club Admin who has access to their club's information.

Club Admins are responsible to be certain all of their members are registered and in compliance at all times. The initial club admin must be assigned by the LSC Admin. After that, Club Admins can assign other members of their club as Admins, Registrars and Head Coaches.

Club Registrars and Head Coaches also have SWIMS access to most of their club's information and can check their members for compliance.

In an effort to help the SWIMS tech people, Please, send any SWIMS or Registration issues to me, the LSC Admin first. I can handle at least 50% of the issues that I've seen come through and if something needs to go beyond me, I can get it to the correct person without bogging down the help desk. (Bill Faucett office@adironackswimming.org)

Clubs – Be certain that I have the most current contact information so that you will all receive information in a timely fashion. Take a look at the AD web site, TEAMS page and email me with any changes in contacts or contact information.

I need to have 3 contacts for each club;

1. A main contact person for general news.
2. A Head Coach to receive and distribute information to all the club's coaches.
3. A Club Admin to handle all SWIMS processes.

*Administrative Official is required to be on deck during meets. Every team that hosts meets must have a certified Admin Official.



B Accurate seeding of preliminary, semi-final and final heats. C Determination and recording of official time. (1) Receiving and reviewing the automatic

and/or semi-automatic timing results from the Timing Equipment Operator and comparing primary timing results with the back-up timing results to determine their validity. (2) Receiving the times recorded by the Head Lane Timers from the Chief Timer and the order of finish data from the Place Judges and using that data to the extent needed to determine the official time for each swimmer. (3) Unless otherwise directed, notifying the Referee whenever a time obtained by the primary timing system cannot be used as the Official Time. (4) Recording disqualifications approved by the Referee. D Determination of the official results. E Publication and posting of results and scores. .3 Shall perform other duties assigned by the Referee

*MAJOR LEGISLATION AND RULE CHANGES FOR 2025: 2. The rules for starting procedures were amended to allow Starters the ability to use any “stand” command when relieving athletes from their starting positions. (Articles 101.1.2, 101.2.3, and 102.12) 3. The rules surrounding Mixed Gender Relays were changed to allow lead-off times to count for relays with compositions other than two male and two female athletes. (Article 101.7.3) 4. The list of recognized events for 13-14 athletes was amended to include the 50s of Butterfly, Backstroke, and Breaststroke. (Article 102.1.2) 5. The Code of Conduct was amended to include national origin as a class protected from Discrimination in violation of the Amateur Sports Act. (Article 304.3.2) 7. 8. The rule regarding the distribution of rulebooks was amended to clarify that non-athlete members were entitled to a printed copy of the rulebook, but must make a request for the physical rulebook, should they desire one. (Article 503.2) [Effective January 1, 2025] 9. The rules surrounding the wearing of wetsuits were amended to give more flexibility to Meet Directors to allow the use of wetsuits in Open Water competition. (Articles 701.1 and 701.4) 10. 12. The annual registration fee for existing clubs was increased to \$225 per year and the registration fee for new clubs was increased to \$750 for their first year. (Resolution of the HOD) [Effective September 1, 2025, for the 2026 registration year]
